HOW TO BUILD GREAT RELATIONSHIPS

ROMANS 16

- Focus on **SERVING**

“I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deacon of the church in Cenchreae. I ask you to receive her in the Lord in a way worthy of his people and to give her any help she may need from you, for she has been the benefactor of many people, including me.” (vv. 1-2)

- Never give up when **THINGS GET TOUGH**

“Greet Priscilla and Aquila, my co-workers in Christ Jesus. They risked their lives for me. Not only I but all the churches of the Gentiles are grateful to them.” (vv. 3-4)

- Remember the **GOOD DAYS**

“... Greet my dear friend Epenetus, who was the first convert to Christ in the province of Asia.” (v. 5)

- Be a bridge – **NOT A BARRIER**

“Greet Ampliatus, my dear friend in the Lord. Greet Urbanus, our co-worker in Christ, and my dear friend Stachys. Greet Apelles, whose fidelity to Christ has stood the test ...” (vv. 8-10)

FINAL THOUGHT:

- Life is **BETTER TOGETHER!**

“Gaius, whose hospitality I and the whole church here enjoy, sends you his greetings ...” (v. 23)
